WORDS OF THE HOST PARTNERS

As part of the 22nd edition of Cratère Surfaces - Ales International Outdoor Festival, a set of joint events are being organised from June 29 to July 3rd 2021, hosted by le Cratère, Scène Nationale d'Alès: a Focus "Territories and Arts", led by the Institut français, the General Meeting of Circostrada Network, coordinated by Artcena, and the Plenary of the European and international projects Collaborative, initiated by Occitanie en scène.

All co-organisers have teamed up to create one single big event, to which we are more than happy to invite you. We have done our best to offer you a most relevant and appealing programme, which will have as a challenge to work through a territorial lens, creating artistic cooperation and common experiences of sharing sensitiveness and situations. This programme will bring together architects, artists, institutions, and personalities from various disciplinary fields. Together, we will reflect on spaces - urban and rural, that question and revisit imaginaries.

Institut français

The Institut français promotes French culture internationally, in dialogue with foreign cultures. It promotes initiatives related to various artistic fields, intellectual engagement, cultural and social innovation, and linguistic cooperation. It promotes the French language around the world, as well as the mobility of works of art, artists and ideas.

The Institut français is the public institution responsible for the international cultural actions of France, under the supervision of the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Culture.

The Institut français in Paris works with the 131 cultural services of the French embassies, and the 98 Institut français headquarters with their 138 branches throughout the world (under the authority of the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs) as well as the 27 French Research Institutes abroad (under the aegis of the MEAE and the CNRS).

Circostrada Network

Circostrada is the European Network for Circus and Street Arts. It was created in 2003 and counts over 120 members coming from more than 35 countries. Its core mission is to further the development, empowerment and recognition of these fields at European and international level. Over the years, it has become an anchoring point for its members and a key interlocutor in the dialogue with cultural policy makers across Europe. Circostrada supports circus and street arts professionals by implementing a wide-range of advocacy and capacity building initiatives. The focus is on boosting professional exchange and innovation, gathering information and resources, fostering continuous training and knowledge-sharing.



ARTCENA, National Centre for Circus, Street and Theatre Arts

ARTCENA supports professionals to pursue their projects and promotes circus, street and theatre arts.

ARTCENA realizes its mission along three axes:

- Sharing knowledge: digital platform and multimedia publications.

On artcena.fr, ARTCENA offers publications and multimedia resources that covers both the history and contemporary reality of circus, street arts and theatre: sector news, multimedia 'dossiers'...

- Professional support: training, guidance and national programs

ARTCENA develops tools and services for professionals and helps to support contemporary creation with its national programs: Aide à la création de textes dramatiques ('Support for Dramatic Writing'), the Grand Prix de Littérature dramatique ('Grand Prize for Dramatic Literature'), and the Grand Prix de Littérature dramatique Jeunesse ('Grand Prize for Dramatic Literature – Youth').

- International development of circus, street arts and theatre

ARTCENA coordinates Circostrada, the European Network for Circus and Street Arts and Contxto, International network for the distribution of French-language dramatic texts.

Le Cratère, scène nationale d'Alès

The scène nationale (a French network of 76 theatres) of Alès was created in 1991. Its new director, Denis Lafaurie, gave it the name of Le Cratère, referring to the fact that the room is below ground level, to the various craters found in the mines of the region and especially to this quote from the vulcanologist Haroun Tazieff who said that "It is on the edge of craters that we see the most beautiful shows".

The Cratère can be considered as one of the most beautiful cultural facilities of the region, with its large theatre room containing 900 seats, its entirely modular room next door with 200 seats and its dance studio.

Every cultural season, it presents more than 60 multidisciplinary shows and 180 performances.

When creating Cratere Surfaces in 1999, le Cratere was one of the first scène nationale to create a street art festival.

Occitanie en scène

Occitanie en scène is the regional agency dedicated to performing arts. It aims to contribute to the artistic and cultural development from a territorial perspective. With view of making it a dynamic region for the creators who live there, and, the land of emergence of new artistic forms, through the lens of territorial cultural planning and reduction of inequalities of access to artistic creation. Occitanie en scène also carries out missions of information and resources, advice and support for artist profile scouting, artistic and professional mobility, and the development of cooperation and international projects. Its fields of action cover the entirety of disciplines under performing arts: circus, dance, music, theatre, and their associated and crossed forms. Occitanie en scène has initiated a Cooperative of European and international projects whose raison d'être is to foster the emergence of a regional platform of support for innovation and European and international cooperation.



CIRCOSTRADA GENERAL MEETING

Circostrada General Meetings can be regarded as the foundations of the network, in the sense that they are an ideal opportunity for the network's members to meet, exchange, share, think together, get to know each other better, discover an artistic landscape, explore topics relevant to their daily work-life, learn about the network's activities, experience what it actually means being a member... and so much more!

These meetings take place twice a year in a different European country and are hosted and coorganised by a Circostrada member in the frame of a festival or an artistic event.

They are always designed around a full and tailor-made programme that is specific to the local context of the organisation hosting it, but still deliver meaningful content for both circus and street arts professionals. A General Meeting at a glance is:

- A privileged sphere to learn about the life of the network, meet the Coordination team and Steering Committee, get to know new members and learn about what they do.
- A chance to discover the circus and street arts scene of the host country, learn about its cultural context, visit key venues and meet local stakeholders.
- An invitation to work with your peers, get involved in the network's activities.
- An occasion to increase your skills and refresh your perspectives by participating in inspiring keynotes, thematic workshops, projects presentations and peer-to-peer exchanges.

INSTITUT FRANÇAIS FOCUS

Focus is a major influence plan for artistic scouting to feed the programmes of prescribing foreign partners and to contribute to better distribution of French artists. Institut français organises the Focuses in partnership with unifying events in France or around partners which enlist the interest of foreign professionals.

They meet together for several days, around a dedicated artistic programme, professionals invited by the French cultural network abroad. Their aim is to facilitate identifying French cultural creation sectors and encourage their distribution in the world. They also enable professionals in a sector to be put in contact with each other.



CRATÈRE SURFACES

In july 1999, took place the 1st edition of Cratère Surfaces, the first festival devoted to street arts in the Languedoc-Roussillon region. Denis Lafaurie, the director of Le Cratère, scène nationale (the national scene) in Alès, decided to create an urban event bringing together artists and audience with free access to the heart of the city.

Since 2010, the festival has become international and has made its name as the "Alès international outdoor festival". It opens its doors to international companies and even offers shows in english. In 2014, the festival goes to the Cévennes for 3 days and makes us discover exceptional forms in remarkable landscapes, before rediscovering its urban euphoria in Alès, the last two days.

Eager to offer top-level entertainment, the festival is characterized by a strong artistic line-up, encouraging among others, theatre actors to take on the streets.

The festival attracts professionals from all over the world who often bring shows that they have discovered in Alès back to their own country.

PLENARY OF THE EUROPEAN AND INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS COOPERATIVE

The European and International Projects Cooperative is a regional platform initiated by Occitanie en scène, supporting innovation and European and international cooperation. It operates in the cultural and creative industries and more specifically in performing arts.

Through the dissemination of information and the support of territorial projects, Occitanie en scène carries out a collective and complementary action, in order to create the conditions for change and European openness to French actors and territories, particularly in the current context of strong transformations of European societies and territories.

Today, the question is to create the conditions for the emergence of cooperation and projects, that can be included in European frameworks.

In order to act, the European and International Projects Cooperative has a range of actions which include annual meetings as plenary sessions.

One of these two annual plenary sessions takes place here during the Cratère Surfaces festival, co-organised with the Institut français, Circostrada Network and Le Cratère, scène nationale d'Alès.

Roundtable #1 "Living together"

How will we live together? Such is the question raised by Hashim Sarkis, General Commissioner of the Venice Architecture Biennale for the 2021 edition. We hereby suggest, through the apostrophe 'Living together' to move beyond the future-oriented dimension of the issue, to focus on the present and illustrate it with deeds, words, concrete and committed manifestos, already laying down collective action as a prerequisite. By introducing projects in which collaboration and dialogue promote interaction and coexistence on up-and-coming territories, this roundtable will also be the opportunity to discuss professional career paths of architects, developing alternative practices that claim the proximity to users and uses.

Margaux Darrieus - Independent journalist (France)

Margaux Darrieus is an architect, PhD and journalist, teaching in Ensa Paris-Malaquais. Member of the laboratory ACS, her research considers the production of space as a collective practice within the architect must deploy strategies to exist and make his projects exist. Her research questions the ways of being and doing of contemporary designers.

Adelaïde Boëlle - Director / Architect / Mediator, <u>Architecture In Vivo</u> (France)

Adélaïde Boëlle holds a master's degree in Architecture. She founded Architecture In Vivo in 2011, an architecture and urban mediation agency based in the south-west of France. She integrates project management teams to design and animate co-construction strategies as an architect-mediator.



François Rascalou - Artistic Director at Action d'espace (France)

François Rascalou made the public space his laboratory for writing and artistic experiments for creation. Artistic Director of Action d'Espace, a Montpellier based company formed in 2007, widely acclaimed for its creativity in public spaces and the specificity of its intimate relationship with the audience.



Marta Jonville - Artistic Director, <u>La Cuisine - Centre d'art et de design</u> (France)

Marta Joinville graduated from ENSA (Limoges, France) and from SPEAP. She has a Master's degree in Arts and Politics created by Bruno Latour. As Artistic Director of La Cuisine, she is developing the programme "Reconciliation" in order to anchor the art center in its territory and involve the communities in the process.





Aurèle Rattez - Architect / Planner, Collectif Yakafokon (Belgium)

The Yakafokon Collective brings together architects, builders, urban planners, cooks and technicians. For several years, the collective has been interested in the place given to children in urban space. Yakafokon carries out artistic residencies in schools, crossing the disciplines of architecture and theatre, and runs design and creation workshops.

Amélie Ailloux - Project Manager of Fil - Atelier & Collectif (France)

Fil- Atelier & Collectif is a double structure born in 2013 in Nantes. The Collectif Fil is a research-action association in architecture and urban planning. It positions itself between the actors of the city to catalyze the energies in situ and to stimulate new approaches of territorial project co-construction. The Atelier Fil is an architecture and urban planning office, prime contractor among the constellation of actors who realize the city, to develop shared projects. Together, they share the values of iteration, frugality and sharing.



Emilie Buestel - Choreographer of <u>Collectif Sauf le dimanche</u> (France)

Emilie and Marie the other choreographer of Sauf le dimanche, have been dancers in several dance companies, both on stage and in public space. They have developed "Sauf le Dimanche" by refining the meaning they give to movement and, above all, the places in which they bring dance, in the spaces of our daily life. Each place they invest is scrutinized, analyzed and sensed in order to lay there the most accurate and sensitive form of movement. This approach leads them to meet a very wide variety of audiences.

Thematic workshop #2 "Unsuspected resources"

Marc Mirallès Elected cultural representative, <u>City of Graulhet</u> (France)

Marc Mirallès was during more than 40 years the artistic director and creator of Plasticiens Volants Cie (street teater cie). For a year now, he is elected at the city council of Graulhet (Tarn, 13000 pop.) and responsable of cultural affairs. Graulhet was the European leather city until the 1980s. Now, many factories are abandoned and taken over by artistic companies.



Vincent Portal -Head of the Culture and Heritage, <u>City of Graulhet</u> (France)

Initially a graphic designer in performing arts, Vincent Portal joined the City of Graulhet to develop innovative projects for people who do not have a natural access to culture. He is in charge of Culture and Heritage since 2014 in Graulhet.



Marie Antunès - Director of <u>l'Atelline</u> (France)

Holder of a DEA in modern letters and a DESS 'direction artistique de projets culturels', and after ten years of directing the public relation's office within the National Opera and Orchestra of Montpellier Occitanie, Marie Antunes took over the management of l'Atelline in November 2017 focusing her work on the presence of artistic acts in public spaces.



Marc El Samrani - CIFRE Researcher at <u>l'Atelline</u> (France)

After he got his master's degree in architecture in Lebanon and a DPEA in scenography in France, Marc engaged in a doctoral research with l'Atelline focusing on the role of cultural and digital mediation in the creation of new urban public spaces as a way to address social issues through the user's spatial experience.

Roundtable #2 "Unsuspected resources"

Moderator: Margaux Darrieus

Speakers: Thierry Boutonnier, Miguel Georgieff, Anne Legile, Fred Sancère

This roundtable tackles the unsuspected potentials of built spaces and natural landscapes which are in abeyance, on hold, sometimes degraded, impoverished in appearance. The stake: to reveal to the inhabitants, elected representatives, decision makers, the strength and power of the imaginaries driven by these spaces, which can be a real driver for their transformation. This roundtable also focuses on the issue of mediation and the specific tools necessary to its design and dissemination. It will also address the diversity of spaces, be it a pavement, a ground floor, a path, a yard, a building, a shoreline, a city...questioned by the vision of residents and the provision of a collaborative toolbox.

Thierry Boutonnier is an arborist artist, deploying through his collective experiments, a wide range of unique behaviors that question modernity and great acceleration. He implements alternatives to face exploitation and our responsibility. He works to develop collective projects rooted in specific territories, designed and co-constructed over a long period of time in order to forge links with the populations and local contexts.



Miquel Georgieff - Landscaper, Coloco (France)

Miguel Georgieff is a member of Coloco collective since 2000. Coloco is a multidisciplinar colective inspired on living systems for our contemporary territories. We work in participative methods of planning for landscape projects, in urban or natural contexts. 'Unsuspected resources' is one of our methodological approaches on urban processes.



Anne Legile - Director of Cévennes National Park (France)

Rural development specialist, I worked in France and Africa, as an economy teacher and project manager in the strengthening of organizations and people empowerment. Currently I am the general manager of the Cévennes National Park, aiming to protect natural resources and promote sustainable development.



Fred Sancère - Director of <u>Derrière le hublot - scène conventionnée d'intérêt</u> national (France)

Fred Sancère is the director of Derrière Le Hublot, a cultural project in rural areas, and of "Fenêtres sur le paysage" an artistic adventure on the Compostela ways. With this project he invites artists to create a collection of permanent artworks-cum- shelters arising from the earth, and of traditional skills.

Given the context we are currently facing, it is now more than ever necessary to give visibility to regional projects, initiatives and organisations. To that end, six projects related to public space, new circus and export will be presenting in this morning session.

The aim is to share inspiring projects and develop regional and international partnerships.



Caroline Obin - Artistic Director of <u>l'Apprentie Compagnie</u> (France)

Caroline Obin, clown artist, has a multidisciplinary formation (circus, theater and visual arts). She multiplies the experiments around the clown through codes of play ranging from theater to performance, from the stage to public space, from clown art to visual arts. Today, as a director, she creates the show Homo Sapiens with 7 clowns that she trains and accompanies.



Camille Daloz - Artistic Director of <u>Le Cri Dévot</u> (France)

Created in 2011 in Montpellier, Le Cri Dévot is a theatre company that explores modern writing through community meetings. Since 2017, the company has been working on the notion of collective memory through an intergenerational project entitled 'Save the date!'. It's in this artistic cycle that we began to develop: '#generation(s)'



Bastien Molines - Artistic Collaborator and actor at Le Cri Dévot (France)

Bastien Molines is an actor and performer based in Marseille and working with le Cri Dévot since 2011. He is part of the intergenerational project entitled 'Save the date!' and more specifically into the "#generation(s)" project about European youth.



Prisca Villa - Artistic Director of NCNC (Spain)

Prisca Villa is a director and actor. Trained in Barcelona and at the FaiAR, she is a co-founder of the Kamchatka company and is the artistic director of the "NCNC team" with which she has created since 2010 over a dozen "NCNC films"; community driven site-specific projects that combine cinema, photography, installations and interventions in the public space.





Gary Shochat - Co-Director of NCNC (Spain)

Gary Shochat is a screenwriter and actor trained in Israel and in Barcelona. He is a co-founder of 'Kamchatka' company, where he met Prisca Villa, and has worked alongside her also as part of the "NCNC team", most recently in developing "Looking for Maria", a new artistic way of relating to community and territory, following the footsteps of the Italian artist Maria Lai.



Jean-Marc Broqua - Director of International Relations at <u>La Grainerie</u> (France) Jean Marc broqua is in charge of the European and international cooperation at la Grainerie, circus factory in Toulouse. He has a long experience of european cooperation, he is the head of the new "pôle européen de production" of la Grainerie and he coordinates Travesía and a new Erasmus+ K1 Consortium in Occitania with l'ESAC TO, la Verrerie, Circa, Acolytes, Carton production, La Chouette diffusion and Média Commun.



Florent Bergal - Artistic Director of <u>le G. Bistaki</u> (France)

Florent Bergal is a director, dancer and object manipulator. He is co-artistic director of the G.Bistaki collective (investigative circus in the public space) and of the Oktobre company (black circus-theatre). A teacher-researcher, he teaches and transmits in many artistic centres around the world.



Zineb Benzekri - Artistic director, writer and comedian at <u>Collectif Random</u> (France)

Zineb Benzekri created collectif Random alongside David Picard as artistic codirector. In 2012, the collectif impulsed Situation(s), a polymorph scenario dedicated to living spaces and their inhabitants. In summer 2021, Insane, a play written by Zineb, will be released. She is also Associated Artist with In-Situ, European platform for creation in public spaces.

Roundtable #3 "Bottom-up urban planning"

Moderator: Dimitra Kanellopoulou

Speakers: Joanne Pouzenc, Julie Sicault-Millé, Théo Mouzard, Elisa Dumay

This roundtable aims to readdress the issue of city making models and the way of considering the territory, both in terms of tools and temporality. It is an opportunity to cross the different schemes experimented in France, with a view to prompting discussion on three cross-cutting ideas linked to bottom-up—urban planning: time, availability and democracy. What are the limits and pitfalls of a concept which has been arousing much interest among the project's stakeholders in the last few years? What lessons can be learned from the experiences carried out in France regarding land management, the wide array of players involved and what are the limits of the exercise? What are the possible pathways towards developing or achieving more sustainable operations, faced with the emergence of new modes of governance and the growing complexity of access to resources (social, economic)? Such are the issues that this roundtable proposes to debate as a springboard to launch dialogue around a new way of thinking the city and to question it through artistic, architectural and hybrid practices.

Dimitra Kanellopoulou - Architect / Engineer, Assistant Professor ENSA Paris-Malaquais (France)

Dimitra Kanellopoulou is an architect-engineer (NTUA, Athens) with a master degree on urban planning (ENPC, Paris) and a Ph.D on urban geography (Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne). She actually holds the position of Assistant Professor at the Ecole Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture Paris-Malaquais. In 2018, she founded Politopia (www.politopia.eu), a consulting firm on urban walking policies and public space's design.

Joanne Pouzenc - Director of <u>Maison de l'Architecture Occitanie-Pyrénées</u> (France)

Joanne Pouzenc is currently Director of the Maison de l'Architecture Occitanie-Pyrénées. She is also director of the publication Plan Libre, a doctoral student at the TESC at UT2J in Toulouse, lecturer at NODE - center for curatorial studies, educator at the school of architecture ENSA Toulouse and an active member of the international collective ConstructLab.



Julie Sicault-Millé - Curator, Banlieue Capitale 2028 (France)

Julie Sicault-Millé graduated from Ecole du Louvre and political sciences, She began her professional career in cultural mediation. After 15 years in a cultural equipment, as head of exhibitions and public collection, she is currently an independent exhibition curator, she teaches and supports various cultural projects.



Théo Mouzard - Architect / builder, <u>Collectif Etc</u> (France)

Collectif Etc is a non-profit organisation since 2009. We support common spaces trough actions that gather people around construction workshops. We're using various mediums like edition, screen printeing, sewing, filmmaking, artistic process. We hope that architecture can be a tool to change our world toward a more social, democratic and ecological ways of life.

Roundtable #4 "Territories with weakened ecosystems"

Moderator: Dimitra Kanellopoulou

Speakers: Sophie Dulau, Eleftérios Kechagioglou, Maud Le Floc'h, Elsa Vanzande

This roundtable aims to explore and debate the weakening of continental and aquatic ecosystems. It deals with investigating the future of territories subject to climate, geological, industrial risks and to discuss the Anthropocene concept in the light of the current social and economic crisis. How can we cope with the risk and its consequences in our daily environment? How can we live with this risk, be it natural, industrial, sanitary or ecological? How can we overcome it and turn it into a source of projects and reflections for the urban or rural areas, through hybrid approaches standing at the crossroads of disciplines? How is resilience built up and using which tools? This roundtable will seek to shed light on these issues.

The sharing of initiatives and experiments put forward by the invited professionals will enable further deepening of the topic of resilience, focusing on the issues of adaptability, memory and water cycle.




Simon Luca Barboni - Artist, Progetto CirkAround, Circuito CLAPS (Italy)


